Electric Car Charging Now Available

Contract Services is pleased to announce that the car chargers on the 2nd floor of our parking structure are now active. Users can access the chargers using a Chargepoint account or with a credit card.

Prices for charging are as follows:

- On-peak (June 1 to October 31) \$0.32 per kWh
 Non-peak (November 1 to May 31) \$0.19 per kWh
- Once charging is complete, users will have a 1-hour grace period to move their cars. Users will be charged \$2.00 per hour (or fraction thereof) after this grace period.

The spaces are reserved for cars that are actively charging. Security will monitor the spaces and hand out warnings. Multiple violations can lead to a loss of parking privileges.

Safety: A Shared Effort

Your commitment to safety is critical for everyone. Going home each day without injury requires a commitment to safe work practices. The success of the Safety Pass program is a result of the cooperative effort between the labor unions, the major motion picture and television studios, and you. With your participation and safe work practices, everyone can get their job done safely and efficiently, without injury.

Noise Exposure Reminder

On Production: Loud noise may permanently damage your inner ear and lead to hearing loss. Continuous exposure to sounds over 85 decibels can cause chronic damage, and any exposure to a sound over 140 decibels can cause immediate damage. Use earmuffs or earplugs any time you are exposed to a loud environment!

Off Production: Noise levels in open office plans can affect health, well-being and productivity. Ideal sound levels in an open office should be between 45 and 60 decibels. By moving that conversation to another room or a less-occupied area, you help everyone work and feel better.
